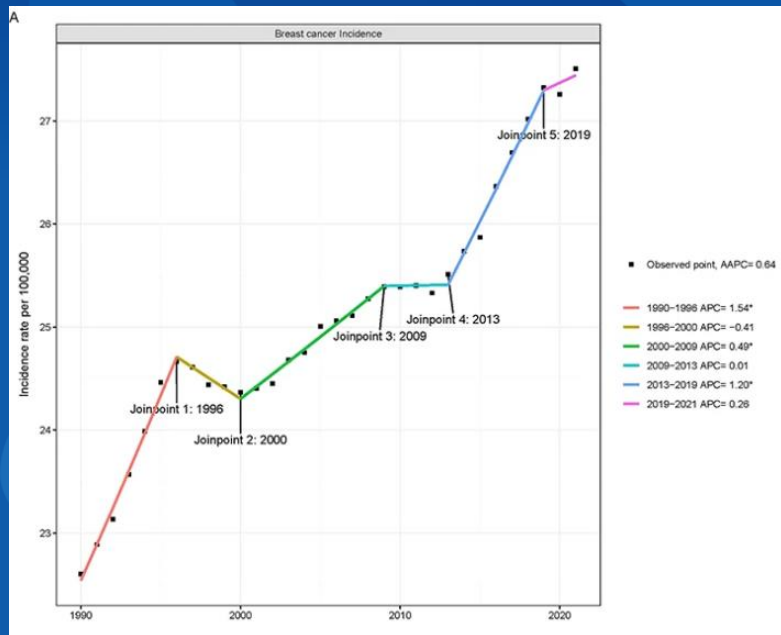


The Breast Care Multi-Disciplinary Team at Beacon Hospital

THE GLOBAL BURDEN OF BREAST CANCER



2.3 million new cases of female breast cancer,
670,000 deaths from female breast cancer - 2022.
Annual rates increased by 1-5% in half of examined countries.

The risk of breast cancer increases with age:



13% of women are diagnosed between the ages of 15-44 years

26% of women are diagnosed between the ages of 45-54 years

24% of women are diagnosed between the ages of 55-64 years

19% of women are diagnosed between the ages of 65-74 years

18% of women are diagnosed over the age of 75 years.

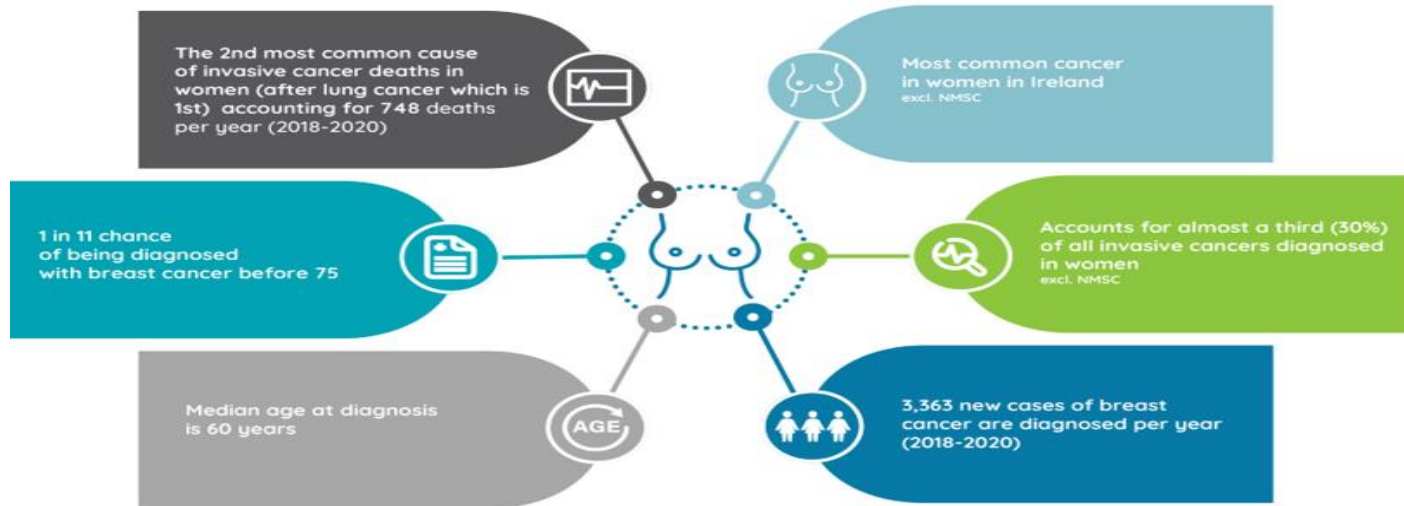

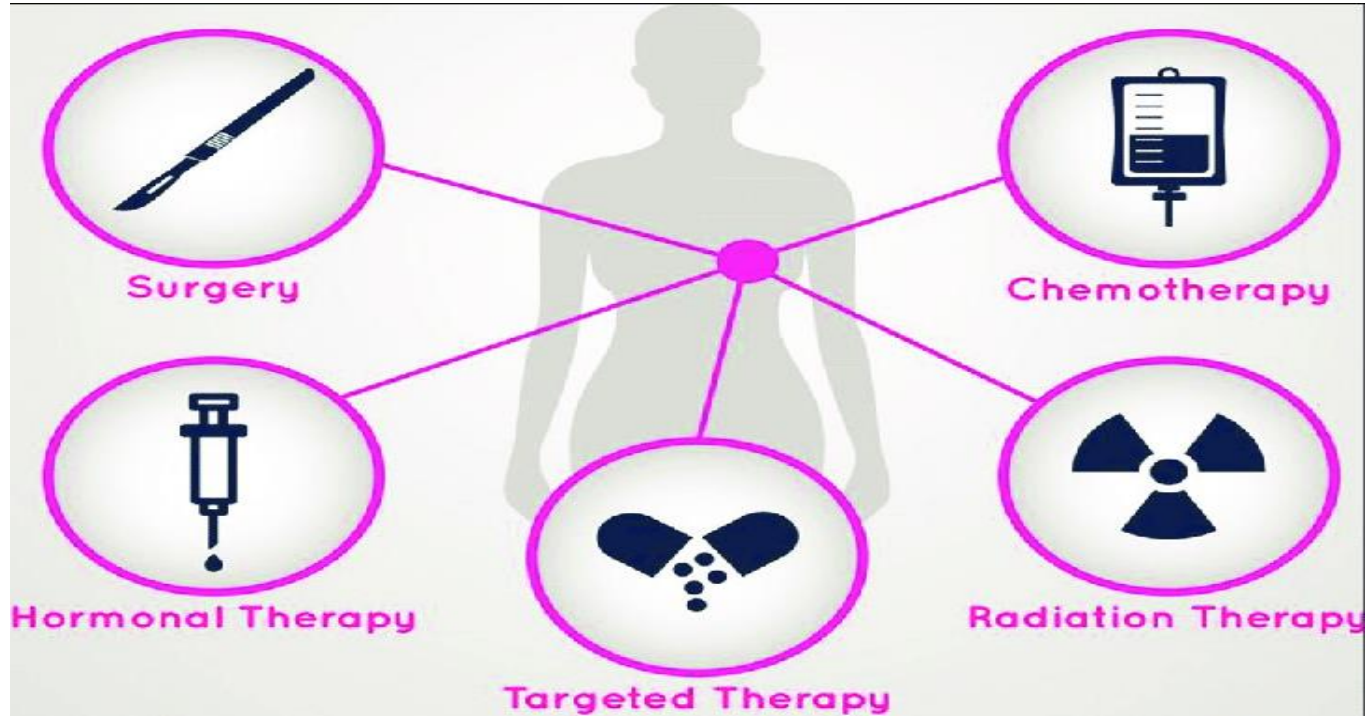

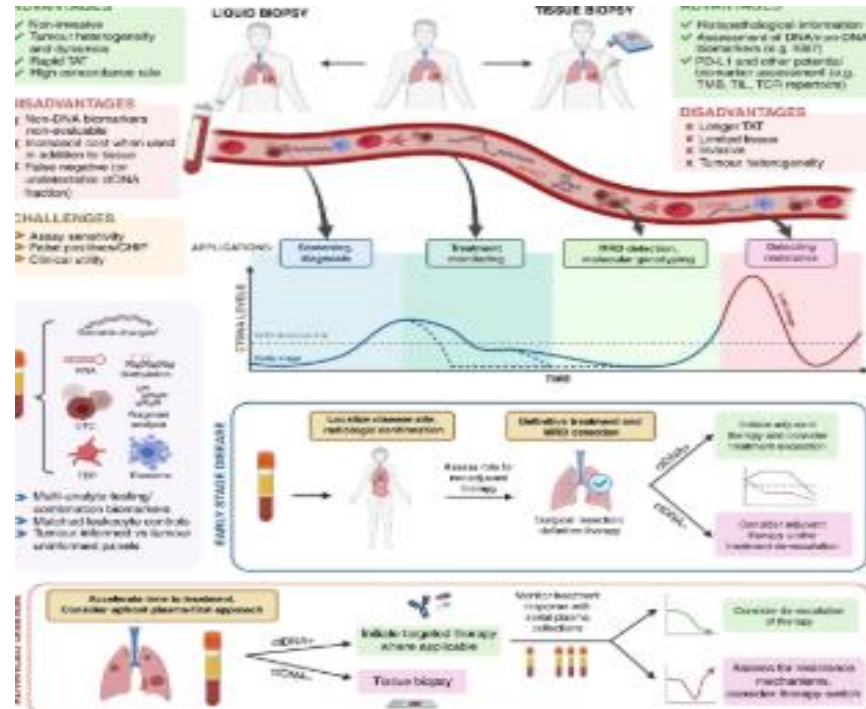
Breast Cancer Trends : Breakthrough Science

Oncotype DX



- 58 % reduction in chemotherapy
- Net saving of 4.7 million euros for the Irish Health care system

Circulating Tumour DNA (ct DNA)



Breast Cancer Trends : Clinical Trial : TREAT ctDNA

Elacestrant for treating ER+/HER2- breast cancer patients with ctDNA relapse (TREAT ctDNA)

International, multi centre, randomised, open label, superiority phase III trial of elacestrant vs standard endocrine therapy in patients with ER+/HER2- breast cancer and ctDNA relapse

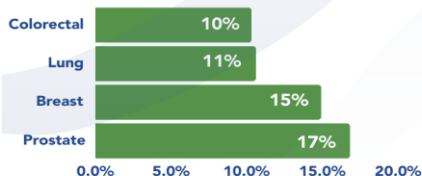

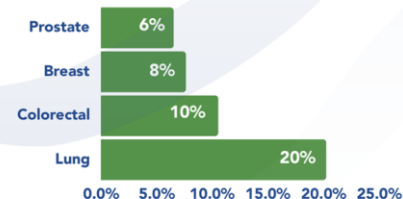
